FIRE SAFETY TRAINING FOR YOUR APPOINTED PERSONNEL

Under current legislation it is a legal responsibility of occupiers of a building to prepare and publish Emergency Response Plans. These plans detail the action to take in the case of an emergency such as a fire, flood or gas leak. Fire Wardens are designated the responsibility of executing the Emergency Response Plan in the event of an emergency. Students are given responsibilities with the skill base to carry out the ERP. It also provide training for students to carry out their own Fire Safety Drill effectively and safely

FIRE WARDENS TRAINING COURSE

Fire is a good servant but a bad master. The effect of any fire on a business or organisation has both short term and long term consequences. It can lead to loss of life, business failure, job losses, financial hardship and service disruption.

The role of the Fire Warden is to ensure that your Emergency Response Plan is executed in a timely and effective manner. This can only be achieved with skill, knowledge and experience. This course will give students the skill and knowledge of fire safety and with experience they will become effective and competent with their roles and responsibilities.

COURSE DURATION

This course takes place over 6 hours. Provision is made for a 30 minute and a 15 minute Refreshment Break. Students must attend the entire course to satisfy the certification criteria.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Assessment of the Students is carried out by the course tutor through their engagement on the course and their participation in the practical skills sessions.

CLASS SIZE

To facilitate the Learning Process the maximum number of students per course is 12 persons.
